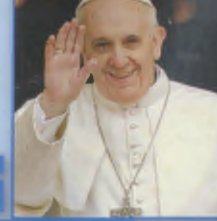

## 對教宗的愛

### 聖施禮華第一次與教宗相見



1946年6月23日九點半，他們抵達位於 9 Piazza della Citta Leonina的家，那裡離聖天使堡和梵蒂岡都很近。

歐華路主教比聖施禮華早一步到達。這間公寓位於頂樓，有個開放遮陽的露台，貝爾尼尼柱廊和 聖伯多祿廣場的景色一覽無遺，教宗私人圖書館燈還亮著的窗戶，也看得清清楚楚。這景色使聖施禮華深受感動，其他人都去休息了，他卻睡意全無，留在露台上。

那天下著雨，眼看聖施禮華越來越近梵蒂岡，他已經為教宗祈禱了一整天。這些年，他一直盼望著見到聖伯多祿的繼承人。他在《道路》中寫著：「公教的、從宗徒傳下來的、羅馬的！我希望你成為親近羅馬的人。你渴望去羅馬『朝聖』。videre Petrum, 『去看伯多祿』。」

如今他已看見教宗住所的窗戶，聖施禮華深刻感受到一份的情感——他曾在《道路》(573條)中描述：「感謝祢，我的天主，在我心中置放了對教宗的這份熱愛。」

### 初見教宗

為了覲見教宗碧岳，施禮華神父7月15日回到羅馬。他渴望向聖父打開自己的胸懷，並且分享他們過去幾天在Fiuggi所做的事。這次覲見，使聖施禮華滿溢著平安和喜樂。

## 信德年之家庭

### 信仰的傳遞 (I)

家庭塑造孩子的人格與性情，使人們對天主的愛穩固。

天主將子女交託給父母親，是為叫他們幸福，因為每個孩子都說明了天主對父母親懷抱信心。信德是父母親傳給子女最寶貴的禮物。信德賦予生命最終的意義，可以說這是唯一重要的事了。這就是為什麼和其他的團體比起來，家庭是最能將信仰紮根在孩子們的心中。但天主不會只給人使命而不給予其他需要的幫助。

#### 個人的見證

在天主教信仰下撫養小孩不僅需要教導教理，更需要傳遞生命的道路。天主的話本身具有效力，但天主想以人的見證做為媒介去傳播聖言。當福音被實實在在的活出來，人對福音的內容就更確信了。這點對小孩子而言更為真切，就算父母加以解釋，他們也很難分清楚實際的內容和誰是說話的人。所以，對他們而言，看見自己的父母祈禱有著特別的意義和蘊含其中的價值。



因此，父母有這樣的先天條件，能將信德分享給孩子們。而比文字更重要的是天主希望父母保持虔誠的信仰生活。自然而然為孩子們立下榜樣，他們個人的見證在任何時候都是舉足輕重的。所以，「讓別人看見你祈禱，這是我從父母那兒學來的，我牢記在心裡。當你們的孩子到了我這年紀的時候，他們將深深懷念父母親身體力行的榜樣，讓孩子們了解需要知道的教理，而不是對他們喋喋不休。」<sup>[1]</sup>

其實孩子們需要看到的是父母從告解聖事中，得到力量而感到快樂，如此更能堅定的持守他們的心。孩子們的覺察力絕對不能輕忽。他們非常了解自己的父母，不管成功失敗，消極地或積極地都會影響孩子們的發展。

本篇十六世經常強調，讓機構和人事上產生巨大的轉變，通常來自於聖人的芳表，而非知識分子及權力。「多變無常的歷史軌跡中，聖人一直是扮演著真正的改革家，當人們身陷黑暗的幽谷時，雖然他們冒著危險，但在一定的時候總會帶來光明。」<sup>[2]</sup>

類似的情形也出現在家庭中。重點是父母要努力修得個人聖德的品格，崇高的品格將引導出信德的能力，好使父母找到最好的教育方式傳遞信仰，更有效率的將需要的陶成灌輸給孩子。「在家庭的溫情之中，虔誠生活的教導同時是本性的和超性的，就以往的經驗在基督信仰的環境中，這樣的教導對孩子有正面的影響。孩子們學會把天主擺在他們情感中的第一位，也是最重要的一位。他們會發現天主像他們的父親，瑪利亞有如自己的母親，孩子們還會像他們自己的父母一樣去祈禱。如此一來，父母親的責任義務就顯明出來了，這不僅是教導而已，而是要過一個完全符合基督的祈禱生活，使他們能和孩子分享對天主的愛。」<sup>[3]</sup>



## 信任和友誼的環境

我們看到時下年輕人特別是十幾歲的青少年，在面對考驗的時候動搖了信德。在無信仰環境下的壓力下；被朋友嘲笑其宗教信仰；傳播無神論的觀念及詆毀天主重要性的教導，都是造成信德動搖的原因。但這些種種因素只有在他們無法敞開心胸向正確的人求教時，這危機才顯得嚴重。

最重要的是父母願意花時間在孩子身上，讓彼此之間培養出信任的情誼。「就算是那些看來倔強冷漠的孩子們也是需要親子間的親密感情。父母絕不可不信任孩子，應該在友誼的氛圍中把孩子帶大，給予他們自由並考量自身責任能力，進而學會如何運用自由。有時，父母親也要扮演被欺騙的角色，因為濫用父母對自己全心的信任，反而會讓孩子們感到羞愧，最後他們會導正自己。相反的，如果孩子沒有自由，感受不到被信任，他們會一直有欺騙父母的傾向。」<sup>[4]</sup> 這種良好的關係不是等到孩子們進入青少年時期才開始，對年紀小的孩子來說已是很有幫助。

溝通是和孩子建立友誼最佳的方式。當兩人存在彼此信任的關係，就等於建立了一座橋梁，使他們能敞開心胸，談論所有煩惱和掛心的事，這是了解彼此的良方。雖說有些年齡層的孩子的是比較難建立這種親密的關係，但父母親仍應努力「成為孩子的朋友，能使孩子願意分享他們的焦慮，找到傾訴的對象，還能給予溫暖而有力的支持。」<sup>[5]</sup>

友誼的環境使孩子們能愉悅的聽人講論天主。這需要父母花時間和孩子們相處，而且所花的時間必須是有「品質」的。孩子會想知道父母親是真的對他們的事感到興趣，並且願意為了他們先放下自己的事情。所以當兒女因著煩惱想找父母談話的時候，父母親應該關掉他們的電腦或電視，或明白地表示他們的注意力轉移到孩子身上。為了有更多的時間和家人相處，讓家人有機會在休閒活動中彼此交流，父母親也要有調整工作時數的準備。

## 自由的奧秘

當人擁有完全的自由，就不會只做對自己有益的事，或只做原本打算做的事。有時我們盡全力去做，但結果卻不是我們所預期的。與其責怪自己或埋怨他人，還不如從中學習並累積經驗，甚至還可幫助別人面對相同的問題。由於每個人的性格不同，看事情的角度也不同，評斷的方法更是不盡相同。每個家庭的孩子也是這樣，就算是生活環境相同也會有出現不同的喜好和敏感度。

而個性上的差異只會讓教育的深度更深更多元。一方面，使教育從個人情感出發，不流於刻板印象。另一方面，孩子們的多元化個性和特質使教育型態更活潑生動。所以，即便信德的探索之路牽涉到人與天主情感的交流，也是人類內心最深最核心的探尋。如果我們把每個不同性格的孩子放在我們個人的祈禱中仔細默想，天主會光照我們，並且給予我們實際行動所需要的指引。

傳遞信德不是一種策略或方案，而是實質地幫每一個人探索天主給他的計畫。我們只想使人去了解自身需要改進的地方。我們無法改變任何人，除非他想改變自己，這是再清楚不過的了。

### 一些其他的看法

在這提出一些對信德的傳遞十分重要的觀點。首先不外乎是在家庭中度虔敬的生活，在祈禱和聖事之中親近天主。當父母把他們與天主的關係在日常生活中呈現出來，使天主臨在家庭裡，同時也會自然尊重孩子的自主性。用餐時感謝天主；一起頌唸晨禱和晚禱；告訴他們可以求助自己的護守天使；對聖母表達敬愛，這些都能培育虔敬的美德，甚至能陪伴孩子一生。



另外教理的教導也非常重要。隨著孩子逐漸成長，在世俗理性思考壓力下，使得他們對教理的忠實性變得脆弱，所以孩子們更需要有深度且務實的信證學知識。但必需考量在不同年齡的孩子身上所產生的不同問題；年長的孩子已具有主動思考的能力，對於可提出問題的時事和書本評論的學習是很好的學習教材。但對較小的小孩來說，堂區或學校的要理問答則是絕佳的教導方式，同時也讓父母跟著複習，或是讓父母用有趣的方式教導他們遺忘的部分。父母親尊重並關心教會的教導有助孩子瞭解學習耶穌教理的重要。



如果只有虔敬的心和完整的教理教導，而沒有伴隨穩固的美德，孩子的想法和認知雖會反映在他們的生活中，但卻不是以信德所體會的理性。所以幫助孩子在美善的德行上紮根是非常重要的。自律、勤奮、慷慨和節制是陶冶美德的重點。這些價值觀的內化使人不只追求生理的滿足，思緒也變得清晰，較能捕捉到思想的精髓。父母養育孩子的過程如果只是一味滿足他們的需求，而不重視紀律，也將無法開啟孩子的心靈之門。

雖然說因為疼愛孩子而不斷滿足孩子的要求，但更好說是直接滿足孩子的要求比教育孩子、控制慾望、教導他們順服而有耐心輕省的多。人的慾望在消費主義下是無窮盡的，受到這樣以自我中心的生活模式影響，使人善變任性，為了滿足慾望伴隨而來的是德行上的缺失，和對他人的冷漠。在所有慾望都被滿足的世界裡，心靈生活卻是被壓抑，獻身和承諾幾乎成為不可能的事。

最後，我們還要考慮到現在的環境充滿誘惑。很多在虔敬的家庭中成長的孩子，必須準備好去面對使人脫離信德的環境。所以，父母要格外慎重的幫助孩子尋找能讓信德和美德滋長的地方受教育。父母親所扮演的角色就像在園圃裡的園丁一樣。我們無法使植物生長，但我們可以澆灌施肥，營造最適合的環境。

聖施禮華曾經給一個由父母親組成的團體建議：「別隱藏你們的虔敬和正直的行為。孩子會跟你們學習，他們將是你們年老時的喜樂和榮冠。」<sup>[6]</sup>

## 喜悅的針藥

路易斯與瑪利亞決定領養若瑟瑪利亞，一個患有唐氏綜合症的孩子，而他們已經是一個有七個孩子的家庭。那時，路易斯亦被確診患上白血病。

2013年4月16日

我們是路易斯和瑪利亞。結婚已二十三年，育有八個子女。我倆成為主業團的成員已多年了。數年前我們以為我們的家庭已經夠大，不會再添新成員。可是，有一天我收到一位朋友的電郵。她告訴我馬德里社區組織請求馬德里唐氏綜合症基金會幫助去尋找願意領養一個被父母遺棄的唐氏綜合症小孩的家庭。



路易斯是一位婦科醫生，他常常以保護由成孕開始的生命為己任，而我倆都積極投入國內與墮胎、產前診斷和唐氏綜合症患者的生活狀況有關的工作。



在家中吃晚飯時我們談論此事。發覺孩子們有着很不同的意見，我們都很感詫異。他們有些贊成，但亦有些說：「你們是否瘋了？我們七個還不夠嗎？」每個孩子因着各自的年紀和看法對事件作出回應。我覺得頗有趣。



若瑟瑪利亞來到家的那天，為我們一家是個很特別的日子，我們安排了小小的慶祝。第二天，我們其中一個女兒將慶祝活動的一些照片帶回學校展示給她的朋友，所以其他人都得悉此事。

透過這樣的一件事情，能讓你聚焦生命中真正重要的東西。就在若瑟瑪利亞到來之前的一段日子，我滿腦子充滿各式各樣的憂慮。我幻想這就像跟任何父母被告知他們的一個孩子患有唐氏綜合症一樣：對將會發生的事情感到恐懼。這個孩子的生命將會怎樣？

如果你未能照顧他的時候，他又會怎樣？可是，最後你會把這些憂慮擱置，並且會說：「喂，我們已幫助七個孩子開展他們的生活，為什麼不能為若瑟瑪利亞做同樣的事呢？我們為什麼不能給他那些我們曾經給我們的孩子一樣的東西：活得開心和成為天主的兒女？」最後你會發覺：我們必能做到！其他一切就交託在天主的手吧。

對我們的孩子都是一樣。我希望他們不單是學業有成和勝人一籌，我更希望他們能夠活得開心和成為天主的好兒女。當你將事情如此簡單化，而我亦認為這是對事情較合理和務實的處理方法，所有複雜的煩亂都會一掃而空。



若瑟瑪利亞來到不久，我們實在經歷了一段困難時光，路易斯被診斷患了重病—白血病。那時，日子過得委實辛苦。他在醫院留醫，而且所有頭髮因為化療而脫落（或者仍有少許留下）。但每當若瑟瑪利亞去探望他的時候，就好像為他注射了一劑喜悅的針藥一樣。

回到家裏，其他孩子告訴我：「媽媽，妳能否想像若果若瑟瑪利亞今年沒有與我們一起，日子是何等艱難的呢？在那些困難的日子裏，若瑟瑪利亞確實帶給我們很大的福樂。他有著一股特殊的力量，將我們每人的優點引發出來。真的，我實在經歷過很多次了。」



## 家務的工作

### 以卓越的家務專業邁向成聖道路的杜麗



歐陽杜麗於1914年1月11日在西班牙里昂的Boca de Huergano出生。1939年遷居馬德里，在那裡遇到聖施禮華神父，並學習如何以主業團的精神聖化工作。

於1946年3月14日，在畢爾包她請求加入主業團，繼續以自己一向從事的事業協助使徒活動。她憑著自己的榜樣及與人建立的友誼，幫助來自不同國家的人專業及靈性上的培育，因而貢獻了主業團使徒工作的擴展。

杜麗一生都是從事主業團中心的家務工作。她懷著愛天主的心工作，關愛她所接觸的人，並以專業的水準去完成一切，不斷地在工作中進修。

許多人在杜麗去世後，對她一生的基督徒表樣，深為感激。蔡浩偉主教於2012年6月18日主持教會審核歐陽杜麗的生平與聖德的法定程序的開幕典禮。她是主業團第一位家務助理獨身成員。

### 喜樂與堅忍

曾經醫治過她的牙醫對杜麗的喜樂與堅忍留下極深刻的印象。他遇見她時，杜麗已年屆八十七高齡，牙醫形容她是「一位高貴的女士，莊重、安詳、雖忍受着嚴重的牙患，還帶着微笑。」她的病歷，是任何牙醫都不願看到的：例如病歷上記載她曾有心臟病發的記錄。

她接受了拔牙手術…杜麗的微笑始終如一，即使她已失去了最後的一顆牙齒，口腔還在疼痛，因日前跌倒令致左腳受傷而需用拐杖行路…我肯保證，她的微笑，不管有沒有牙齒，都能令她身旁的人感到平安。

### 我們的車遭到爆竊了

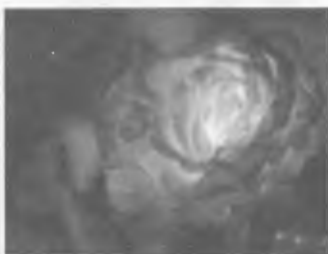

## Love for the Pope

### Saint Josemaría meets a Pope for the first time



June 23rd, 1946. It was nine-thirty when they reached home, an apartment at 9 Piazza della Citta Leonina, just a few yards away from the wall connecting the Vatican with Castel Sant' Angelo.

The apartment, which Don Alvaro had taken shortly before the Father arrived, was on the top floor of the building. Its open balcony, a sheltered terrace, looked out on the Bernini Colonnade and St. Peter's Square. The lighted window of the Pope's private library was plainly visible. This view, deeply moving

to the Father, drove away any thought of sleep. While the rest went to bed, he remained on the terrace.

He had spent the whole of that rainy day praying for the Pope as he drew nearer to the Eternal City. The desire to see Peter (*videre Petrum*) had been with him for years. In *The Way* he expressed it like this:

"Catholic, apostolic, Roman! I want you to be very Roman, ever anxious to make your "pilgrimage" to Rome, *videre Petrum* — to see Peter."

Now he could see the windows of the papal apartments, and he felt a deep affection — affection he had also expressed in *The Way* (no. 573): "Thank you, my God, for placing in my heart such love for the Pope."

### Meeting the Holy Father for the first time

On July 15, Father Josemaría returned to Rome, for the private audience with Pope Pius scheduled for the next day. He looked forward to opening his heart to the Holy Father and bringing him up to date on the work accomplished in the last few days in Fiuggi. The audience left him filled with great peace and happiness.

## The Family in the Year of the Faith

### Passing on the Faith (I)

**The family is the forge of a child's character and personality, and where love for God takes root.**

**August 24, 2012**

Every child is God's vote of confidence in the parents, by entrusting to them a son or daughter called to eternal happiness. Faith is the best legacy parents can pass on to their children. It is the only thing that's truly important, since it is what gives ultimate meaning to our life. And God never gives a mission without providing the means needed to carry it out. That is why no human community is better equipped than the family to ensure that faith takes root in a child's heart.

### Personal testimony

Bringing up a child in the Catholic faith involves more than just teaching doctrine; it also requires transmitting a way of life. Although the word of God is effective by itself, to spread it God has wanted to make use of the mediation of human testimony. The Gospel is convincing to others when it is seen lived out. This is especially true with children, who have difficulty distinguishing between what is said and who is saying it — even more so when it's their father or mother who is speaking. Seeing their own father or mother praying thus has quite special meaning and value for them.



Therefore parents have every advantage in communicating faith to their children. More than words, what God expects is that they be pious and consistent in living the faith. The parents' personal testimony should be evident at all times, giving example to their children with naturalness, without any show. "Let them see you pray. That's what I saw my parents do, and it's engraved on my heart. So when your children reach my age, they will fondly remember their mother and father, who forced them only by their example and smile, giving them doctrine when needed, without pestering them."<sup>[1]</sup>

Sometimes children only need to see their parents' joy after going to confession for faith to take firmer hold in their hearts. The perceptiveness of children should never be underestimated. They know their parents very well, both what's good about them and what's not so good, and everything the parents do, or fail to do, is for them a message that positively or negatively affects their development.



Benedict XVI has often stressed that profound changes in institutions and people are usually the result of the saints, not of the learned or powerful: "Amid the vicissitudes of history, it has been the saints who have been the true reformers, who have so often lifted mankind out of the dark valleys into which it constantly runs the risk of sinking back again, and have brought light whenever necessary."<sup>[2]</sup>

Something similar happens in families. Certainly, parents need to find the best pedagogical means to pass on the faith, and seek the formation needed to teach it effectively. But the key is the parents' own effort to attain holiness. Personal sanctity brings

with it the ability to find the best way to teach the faith. “Experience shows in all Christian environments what good effects come from this natural and supernatural introduction to the life of piety given in the warmth of the home. Children learn to place God first and foremost in their affections. They learn to see God as their Father and Mary as their Mother and they learn to pray following their parents’ example. In this way, one can easily see what a wonderful apostolate parents have and how it is their duty to live a fully Christian life of prayer, so they can communicate their love of God to their children, which is something more than just teaching them.”<sup>[3]</sup>

### Atmosphere of trust and friendship

We also see the reality today that many young people — especially in their teenage years — weaken in their faith when they are tested. The origin of these crises can vary widely: pressure from a paganized environment, friends who ridicule others’ religious convictions, a teacher who imparts an atheistic viewpoint or denigrates the importance of God. But these crises become serious only if those undergoing them are unable to open up their hearts to the right people for advice.

It is important that parents foster an atmosphere of trust with their children, and always be available to devote time to them. “Children — even those who seem intractable and unresponsive — always want this closeness, this fraternity, with their parents. It is a question of trust. Parents should bring up their children in an atmosphere of friendship, never giving the impression that they do not trust them. They should give them freedom and teach them how to use it with personal responsibility. It is better for parents to let themselves ‘be fooled’ once in a while, because the trust that they have shown will make the children themselves feel ashamed of having abused it — they will correct themselves. On the other hand, if they have no freedom, if they see that no one trusts them, they will always be inclined to deceive their parents.”<sup>[4]</sup> Nor is there any need to wait until children reach adolescence to put this advice into practice, since it is useful even for very young children.

Having conversations with one’s children, besides being very enjoyable, is the best way to build a real friendship with them. When two people have a relationship of trust, a bridge is created between them that facilitates opening up one’s heart and speaking about one’s worries and concerns, which is also a good way to get to know oneself better. Although it’s true that certain ages are more difficult than others for achieving this closeness, parents should always strive to become “their children’s friends — friends with whom they will be willing to share their anxieties, who will listen to their problems, who will help them in an effective and agreeable way.”<sup>[5]</sup>

In this atmosphere of friendship, children can hear about God in a pleasant and appealing way. This requires that parents make time to spend with their children, and that it be “quality” time. Children should sense that their parents have a real interest in their concerns, and are even willing to set aside their own concerns for them. Parents therefore need to be ready to turn off the television or computer — or clearly turn their attention away from it — when a son or daughter comes and wants to talk about something that is bothering them. They need to be ready to cut back in the amount of time devoted to work in order to have time to spend with the family; to look for opportunities for leisure-time activities that facilitate conversation between family members, etc.



## The mystery of freedom

Where true freedom is found, people don't always do what's best for them, or what we would have hoped for given our efforts on their behalf. Sometimes we do things well and they still turn out badly, or at least seemingly so. When this happens, it's no use blaming ourselves, or others, for it. The best response is to gain experience so as to be able to educate ever better, and help others to do the same. There are no magic formulas here. Everyone has their own way of being, and their personal way of looking at and judging things. The same is true of children in the family who, although living in a similar environment, have quite different interests and sensitivities.

But this diversity is not an obstacle; rather it broadens educational horizons. On the one hand, it allows education to take place within a personal relationship, far from stereotypes. On the other, the diversity of children's dispositions and characters fosters a wide variety of educational formats. Therefore, although the path of faith is the most personal path possible, since it involves the deepest core of the human person and one's relationship with God, we can help each person to undertake it. If in our personal prayer we reflect carefully on each child's way of being, God will give us the light needed to act effectively.

Transmitting faith, more than a strategy or program, is the effort to help each person discover God's plan for his or her life. We want to help each one discover on their own what they need to improve in, where they need to change. For it is more than evident that by ourselves we cannot change anyone: others change because they want to.



## Some specific points

A number of points that are very important for passing on the faith might be mentioned here. First of all, perhaps, the life of piety within the family, closeness to God in prayer and the sacraments. When parents don't "hide," even unintentionally, this area of their life, the relationship with God is manifested by actions that make Him present within the family, in a natural manner that respects the children's autonomy. Saying grace at meals, reciting with the younger ones morning and evening prayers, teaching them to turn to their guardian angel and to show small signs of affection towards our Lady, are specific ways to foster the virtue of piety in children, giving them resources that can accompany them during their whole life.

Another important means is doctrine. Piety without doctrine is highly vulnerable to the intellectual pressures children will be subjected to throughout their lives. They need a knowledge of apologetics that is both in-depth and practical. Obviously, in this area as well, it's important to take into account age-specific considerations. Quite often, comments about a current topic or a book will provide a good opportunity to teach doctrine to older children; or it may be they themselves who take the initiative and approach their parents with questions. For younger children, the catechism classes they may receive in the parish or at school are an ideal opportunity for parents to review with them what they have learned, or to teach them in an interesting way certain points of the catechism that may have been omitted. The respect and love parents show for the Church's teachings will help children understand the importance of studying Jesus' doctrine.

Another key aspect is helping virtues to take root in children. If piety and doctrine are not accompanied by solid human virtues, children's thoughts and feelings will end up reflecting the way they live, and not what reason informed by faith dictates to them. Forming virtues requires stressing the importance of self-discipline, hard work, generosity and temperance. For the assimilation of these values raises the human person above mere physical appetites, and makes one more clear-minded, better

able to grasp the realities of the spirit. Parents who bring up their children without any real discipline — never saying “no” to them, but instead striving to meet all their expectations — can end up closing the doors to their spirit.

Being condescending towards children in this way, although it might seem to stem from affection, is often really the desire to spare oneself the effort needed to raise children effectively, to set limits on their appetites, to teach them obedience and patience. And since the desires fostered by consumerism are, in themselves, insatiable, falling prey to it leads to a capricious and self-centered lifestyle, a spiral of self-seeking that always entails a deficit of human virtues and of concern for others. Growing up in a world where all of one’s whims are satisfied stifles the spiritual life, and can make self-giving and commitment almost impossible.

Finally, we need to take into account the pressure of today’s environment, for it can be very persuasive. We all know children brought up in a pious family who have been pulled away from the faith by an environment they weren’t prepared to face. Therefore parents need to be very careful about where children are educated, and help create or seek out places that foster growth in the faith and human virtues. The role of parents here is similar to what happens in a garden. We’re not the ones who make plants grow, but we can provide the fertilizer and water that’s needed, and a suitable atmosphere.

St. Josemaría once advised a group of parents: “Don’t hide your piety. Act uprightly. Then they will learn, and your children will be the crown and joy of your maturity and old age.”<sup>[6]</sup>

## An Injection of Joy

**Luis and Maria decided to adopt Josemaría, a child with Down Syndrome, when they already had seven children in their family. And then Luis was diagnosed with leukemia...**

January 04, 2013

Our names are Luis and Maria. We have been married for twenty-three years and have eight children. We have also been supernumeraries of Opus Dei for many years. Several years ago we began to think that our now quite large family was not going to have any new members.



Then one day I received an e-mail from a friend of mine. She told me that the Community of Madrid had asked the Madrid Down Syndrome Foundation for help to find a family for a Down Syndrome child whom the parents had given up for adoption at birth.

Luis, who works as a gynecologist, has always tried to make his work a defense of life from the moment of conception. Both of us are deeply involved in all the questions related to abortion, prenatal diagnosis, and the situation of those with Down Syndrome in our country.

At home we talked about it over dinner. We were surprised to find that our children had quite varied opinions. Some were in



favor of it, but several said: have you gone crazy? Aren't the seven of us enough for you? Each child reacted in accord with his or her age and point of view. It was quite amusing to see.

The day Josemaría arrived was a special day in our family, and we had a small celebration. Next day one of our daughters brought photos of our family celebration to school and showed them to her friends. So everyone knew about it.

An event like this helps you to focus on what is truly important in life. In the days leading up to Josemaría's arrival, all kinds of worries kept going through my head. I imagine it's the same with parents who have been told that their child will be a Down Syndrome child: the fear of what the future will bring, what this child's life will be like, and what will happen

if you're not there to look after him. But in the end you have to set all these worries aside and say: look, we've already helped seven children get started in life. Why shouldn't we be able to do the same for Josemaría? Why can't we give him what we gave our other children: the possibility of being happy and being a child of God? And in the end you realize: we can certainly do that! And everything else we can leave in God's hands.

The same is true with my other children. What I truly want for them isn't merely that they do well at school or get ahead in life.

Rather I want them to be happy and to be good children of God. When you simplify things in this way, which I think is quite a realistic way of looking at things, and also make it practical, all the complications disappear.

Soon after Josemaría's arrival, we went through some truly tough times. Luis was diagnosed with a serious illness, leukemia. Those were hard days. He was in the hospital and lost all his hair — or the little he had left — due to the chemotherapy. But each time Josemaría came to see him, it was an injection of joy.

Back home, my other children told me: mama, can you imagine how bad this year would have been if we hadn't had Josemaría with us? For Josemaría has been a great blessing for our family during these difficult months. He has a special ability to draw out the best from each one of us at home. It's true. I've seen it time and again.
