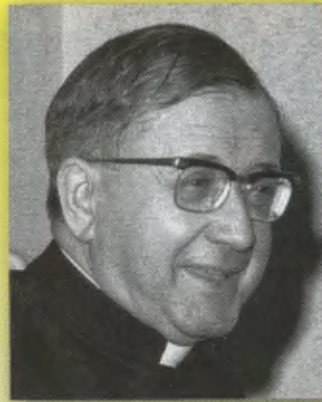


Prayer

Justice Needs Charity

"The circumstances of the servant in the parable who owed ten thousand talents, are a good summary of our situation before God. We too are unable to find the wherewithal to pay the enormous debt we have contracted for so much divine goodness, a debt which we have increased through our personal sins. Even though we fight resolutely, we can never properly repay the great debt that God has forgiven us. However, divine mercy fully makes up for the impotence of human justice. God can say he is satisfied and can remit our debt, simply because he is good and his mercy infinite.

The parable, as you will remember, ends with a second scene which is the counterpoint of the first. The servant, whose huge debt has just been cancelled, took no pity on a fellow servant who owed him only a hundred pence. And it is here that the meanness of his heart comes to light. Strictly speaking, no one will deny him the right to demand what is his. Nevertheless, there is something inside us that rebels and tells us that his intolerant attitude is very far from real justice. It is not right that a person who only a moment previously has been treated with mercy and understanding, should not then react with at least a little patience towards his own debtor. Remember that justice does not consist exclusively in an exact respect for rights and duties, as in the case of arithmetical problems that are solved simply by addition and subtraction."

He Preached About Seeing Christ in the Sick

“In the long hours he had been spending each day at the bedside of the sick, united to their sufferings, witnessing their misery, consoling them with his presence, and erasing their spiritual miseries in the Sacrament of Penance, Saint Josemaría had come to see shining forth in them the lovable and suffering figure of Christ: Christ merciful, Christ patiently enduring, Christ loaded down with the weight and ugliness of sin, Christ bearing with us our sorrows and sufferings. And as a priest, an “other Christ”, he identified with the sick in sorrow and compassion. His yearning to see and help Christ in the sick carried Saint Josemaría’s heart to the hospital... As a companion of Saint Josemaría describes it, “It was a very hard and very thankless job. Anti-Catholic sentiment was everywhere and many of the patients insulted us. Here we were, fixing up their hair, shaving them, trimming their nails, bathing them, cleaning the spittoons (...) It was horribly disgusting. We went there on Sundays, in the afternoon, and left nauseated.”

Particular Concern for Others

“Saint Josemaría used to tell people who have many employees. “As much as possible, you should remember that you are dealing with people who have specific needs and you should try to know what those needs are.” He respected, up to the smallest details, people’s right to a peaceful rest. When the Central Office of Opus Dei was being renovated, he took note of the timetable and milestones of the construction company but he never visited the site during the time when the workers were having their lunch break. He wanted (...) that they be able to take lunch peacefully. He made sure that unnecessary hazards were avoided in their workplace (...) I saw how he was concerned about the safety of the workers in the Central Office. He never forgot to pray everyday that there be no accidents in the jobsite and, thanks be to God, there were none.”

He gave this advice to mothers: “Mamas, take your children to Confession, as my mama did me. That way, your children can easily get used to receiving the sacrament of Penance and being reconciled with God. By receiving this sacrament with all the dispositions required for a good Confession, a child will acquire an ever more delicate conscience and will become happier.”

Patience in the Work of Evangelization

“An evangelizing community gets involved by word and deed in people’s daily lives; it bridges distances, it is willing to abase itself if necessary, and it embraces human life, touching the suffering flesh of Christ in others. Evangelizers thus take on the “smell of the sheep” and the sheep are willing to hear their voice. An evangelizing community is also supportive, standing by people at every step of the way, no matter how difficult or lengthy this may prove to be. It is familiar with patient expectation and apostolic endurance. Evangelization consists mostly of patience and disregard for constraints of time. Faithful to the Lord’s gift, it also bears fruit. An evangelizing community is always concerned with fruit, because the Lord wants her to be fruitful. It cares for the grain and does not grow impatient at the weeds. The sower, when he sees weeds sprouting among the grain does not grumble or overreact. He or she finds a way to let the word take flesh in a particular situation and bear fruits of new life, however imperfect or incomplete these may appear. The disciple is ready to put his or her whole life on the line, even to accepting martyrdom, in bearing witness to Jesus Christ; yet the goal is not to make enemies but to see God’s word accepted and its capacity for liberation and renewal revealed. Finally an evangelizing community is filled with joy; it knows how to rejoice always. It celebrates every small victory, every step forward in the work of evangelization.”

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Mercy is the Principal Virtue

“Saint Thomas Aquinas taught that the Church’s moral teaching has its own ‘hierarchy’, in the virtues and in the acts which proceed from them. What counts above all else is ‘faith working through love’ (Gal 5:6). Works of love directed to one’s neighbor are the most perfect external manifestation of the interior grace of the Spirit: ‘The foundation of the New Law is in the grace of the Holy Spirit, who is manifested in the faith which works through love.’ Thomas thus explains that, as far as external works are concerned, mercy is the greatest of all the virtues: ‘In itself mercy is the greatest of the virtues, since all the others revolve around it and, more than this, it makes up for their deficiencies. This is particular to the superior virtue, and as such it is proper to God to have mercy, through which his omnipotence is manifested to the greatest degree.”

“Despite the tide of secularism which has swept our societies, in many countries – even those where Christians are a minority – the Catholic Church is considered a credible institution by public opinion, and trusted for her solidarity and concern for those in greatest need. Again and again, the Church has acted as a mediator in finding solutions to problems affecting peace, social harmony, the land, the defence of life, human and civil rights, and so forth. And how much good has been done by Catholic schools and universities around the world! This is a good thing. Yet, we find it difficult to make people see that when we raise other questions less palatable to public opinion, we are doing so out of fidelity to precisely the same convictions about human dignity and the common good.”

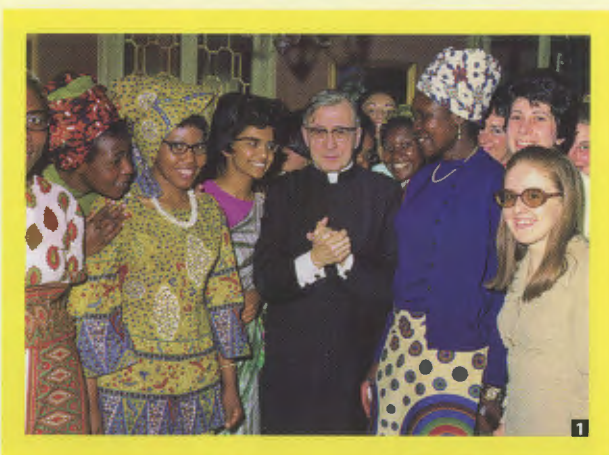

A Doctor at the Precise Moment

Then the female Chief of Neurology took me by the arm, brought me to her office and asked me, "Are you a Catholic?" to which I replied without hesitation, "Yes". She continued telling me, "I will give you a prayer card of someone to whom you will pray because we would like to cure your husband but we do not know what he has and where science does not reach, God can." She gave me a prayer card of Saint Josemaría.

I went to the place where my husband was, showed him the prayer card and told

him: "now let us ask him for your cure." We placed the card on the headboard of his bed and that night we prayed it together.

The following day, a doctor who usually does not see patients in our section came. I do not have the slightest doubt that he was sent by Saint Josemaría. When I asked my husband what he asked the saint that night, he told me, "I only asked for one sign, an opportunity, because if I continue having these

pains, I prefer to die." My husband was diagnosed to have cluster headaches and to this day he continues to live a normal family and work life. From that day onwards, we became devotees of Saint Josemaría and I never stop recounting our experience and spreading the devotion to him.
