The Family: a place of joy

The first Christians well understood the essence of the Gospel message and consequently that joy is inseparable from holiness. The Christian life is one endless feast day, wrote Clement of Alexandria in the 2nd Century.

In this sense, St. Josemaría lived and taught others to live the struggle for sanctity joyfully. Among his many invitations in this regard is his constant affirmation that Christian homes should always be bright and cheerful.

Paquita and Tomas were able to reflect this spirit faithfully. A niece, who spent some time in the summer with them, recalls: “Their house was always filled with joy. It was a home where one felt the presence of God. Without spending much, they celebrated everything: some pickles and a few chips were enough to have a good time.”¹ And the daughter of the mayor of the village where they used to go on holiday wrote:

“Every year we waited for them enthusiastically, because they filled the village... not only because they were a large family, but because of their joy, friendliness, goodness, kindness, and all their other virtues that made life so pleasant for all of us who had anything to do with them.”²

A neighbour remembers of Paquita: “She was always cheerful and smiling and she transmitted that sense of happiness, not only in her home, but also to my family and to the other neighbours”.³ Another of her friends can’t forget how she “radiated peace and joy with her words, gestures and smile. How pleasant it was to be with her!”⁴

About Tomás, a good friend writes: “He knew how to spread peace and happiness around, not only amongst his family, but among his friends, colleagues and acquaintances in the same way.”⁵ And one of his former students says that “his joy was contagious, I would even say radiant. After talking to him we always came away feeling good”.⁶

Joy and good humour were always present in their lives, even in the midst of difficulties or illnesses. After Tomás died, Paquita wrote to one of her children: “The certainty that he is in Heaven means we have to say: Thank you, my God! We want what you want and will continue being happy always”.⁷

As their children and those who dealt with them testify, the union that Paquita and Tomás had with God, through the spirit they learned from St. Josemaría in Opus Dei, made of their family life one endless feast day.
