
Servant of God Guadalupe Ortiz de Landázuri



Care for the Needy

Guadalupe was a natural as far as teaching others to care for the needy. In Madrid, at Christmastime in 1959, she moved the hearts of friends she dealt with when she organized a big charity program so that many less-privileged people would feel the human warmth of the season. This is how she relates it in a letter to the Founder of Opus Dei, with

some witty references to her heart ailment. "For nochebuena we received donations of food bags complete with Christmas lunch and dinner (...) All the families living in the two districts where we have dispensaries (Belmonte and Valdebebas) received ham, sausages, turrones... food common to rich people. We delivered the food

bags to each house. Father, I am sure you would have wanted to see how everyone collaborated (...): the truck drivers, the husbands, the boys of the district who carried the boxes full of food bags (...) We also brought some to the poor ones at the district of the Basilica of San Miguel. Those folks were increasingly amazed with each passing day. Most of the women there were almost octogenarians, many of them with heart ailments - which for me is somewhat of a guarantee that I would reach old age too. Many cried upon seeing with what affection the ladies brought them things." (Letter to St. Josemaría, January 9, 1960).1

Her charity was not something momentary. The following passage illustrates her apostolic zeal to reach all sectors: "Father, please pray a lot for the work with Cooperators. We are dealing with many people from high society, and there is so much to be done; we are also in the poorer districts where we have dispensaries and teach catechism, helping the simple folk. Today a group of girls went for a pilgrimage. They are workers between 18 and 20 years old. They usually meet on Sunday mornings for the circle in Valdebebas. One can see how they are getting closer to our Lord" (Letter to St. Josemaría, May 25, 1959).²

Then, I was able to get in touch with a friend whom I have been trying to reach for a long time. Eventually, she and her family came closer to God. Finally, another friend conceived a child after many attempts. I keep on entrusting to Guadalupe the requests for prayers that others make to me, and I can't seem to get used to the effectiveness of her help.
