“He had a certain difficulty in expressing himself. But he had the gift of getting on with people; he inspired great confidence; he had a great sense of humour; and he knew how to relate a joke with great refinement, affection and a sense of timing.”

Ever since Fr José María met Opus Dei, he was impressed by the text of Christ’s new commandment which the Founder had wanted to be placed in all the Centres used for the apostolic work with young people: “A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another” (John 13:34-35). Fr José María’s love for others was a consequence and a sign of his faith and love for God. His charity with his neighbour was strong and sincere, without making distinctions of persons, and directed to fostering an authentic desire for sanctity among those he treated with, so that they would be happy on earth, and then in Heaven. He was a man of great apostolic zeal and a magnanimous heart.

That is how the testimony of José Gabriel de la Rica, who knew him in Germany, can be explained. “When I met him in 1963, although the Work in Germany was very small, he talked about what it would be like in the future with such conviction that it could not be understood without gigantic faith. Without any material means and having his feet very much on the ground, he encouraged us to get to know people, and to work everywhere, even though we did not see any apostolic fruit. He worked thinking about the future, without having any doubt that the Work would develop

in every country, as in fact it did.”¹

Alejandro Digón states: “He did not cease to start any apostolic task, even if it was difficult, because he knew that the Lord would provide the increase.”² Alfonso Par also remembers those early years in Germany, where Fr José María had gone when he was over fifty years old: “When he came everything changed. That is to say, we felt sure, protected and directed. It was like a change from a cloudy day to splendidly sunny day. The same external reality of the work, with its objective difficulties, but now full of colour, meaning and life, with a clear vision and optimistic perspectives.”³

Those who knew him, know that Fr José María did not express himself easily in other languages, but his enthusiasm and affection moved people more than his words did. He looked for examples that would make what he was saying more understandable, according to the testimony of María Jesús Luna: “I think he had a certain difficulty in expressing himself. But he had the gift of getting on with people; he inspired great confidence; he had a great sense of humour; and he knew how to relate a joke with great refinement, affection and a sense of timing.”⁴

A doctorate, with neither holidays nor weekends free

A few years after finishing my undergraduate studies in Spain I wanted to do my doctoral thesis in Law, but with my family and professional obligations, this was not possible. Some years later I went to live in Latin America, a continent thousands of miles away. In my new country I also had professional, social and family obligations, and work for a charity, so that I had no time either.

Years went by. I ceased being a young student and became a mature professional. Then a biography of Fr José María Hernández Garnica came into my hands. I read that he had been very busy with jobs given to him by St Josemaría, the founder of Opus Dei. But he had found time to do two doctorates, one in mining engineering in 1940 and another in natural sciences in 1970 when he was much older. As I was still interested in doing my doctorate, I took it up again, and during the last two years of my doctorate, I asked him to have some time and to be successful in the development of the suggested theme, arbitration. I also went a couple of times to Barcelona, to visit the church of Montalegre, to ask him to help me. And I asked friends to visit Chiqui's crypt, to ask for my doctorate.

Finally, after spending several years dedicated to work and to my obligations, during which I did not have any holidays or weekends free, I defended my doctoral thesis last November, receiving a unanimously exceptional *cum laude*, and congratulations from the tribunal. Without the help of Fr José María Hernández Garnica I would not have been able to finish the thesis.

I promised Chiqui that as soon as I did the defence of my thesis, I would write this favour down so that his intercession would be known and this would encourage those in intellectual work to appeal to him. I enclose a donation for the cause of his beatification.
